You will be automatically enrolled into Cigna True Choice Medicare (PPO).

About Your New Plan:

Important Things to Know:

- You must be enrolled in Medicare Parts A and B to participate in the Cigna MAPD plan.
- Put your Medicare card in a safe place in case you need it later. You will use only your Cigna ID card for Medical and Prescription Drug coverage.
- You can use any willing Medicare medical provider, regardless of if the provider is in or out of the Cigna network.
- No referrals are needed for Medicare covered medical services.
- You should continue to be able to use almost any retail pharmacy as Cigna includes over 65,000 in-network pharmacies, nationwide.



- Cigna also offers a Mail Order Pharmacy called Express Scripts for your convenience. If you would like to use the Express Scripts Mail Order Pharmacy, you will need new prescriptions.
- You do not need new prescriptions for retail pharmacies. Simply show your new ID card and your refills will be processed under the Cigna MAPD plan.

We are required by law to give you the choice of opting out of the new plan. Since you are currently enrolled in the Frederick County Government Medical and Prescription Drug plan it is unlikely that you would not be able to participate in the new robust Cigna MAPD plan. However, you have the option to opt-out. If you opt out, you will not have medical and prescription coverage through Frederick County Government.
