## **Important Information About Your Town of Farmington/Farmington Board of Education Retiree Prescription Drug Benefits**

Dear Medicare-eligible Retiree and/or Dependent,

We are pleased to inform you that there will be a change to your Prescription Drug coverage provided by the Town of Farmington and Farmington Board of Education. This change is being made to address the continually increasing cost of coverage and to ensure that Medicare-eligible participants have access to comprehensive prescription drug coverage at the most affordable cost.

Your new Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) will be provided by  
Express Scripts Medicare® (PDP)  
**effective July 1, 2025**

The Town of Farmington will continue to work with RetireeFirst, a retiree benefits management solutions and advocacy service provider. RetireeFirst Advocates are US-based and available to help you navigate the complex retiree healthcare landscape and troubleshoot any issues you may have with your insurance carrier, provider's office, and pharmacy.

## **About Your New Plan**

### **Plan Highlights**

- \$0 Copays at participating pharmacies
- \$0 Deductible
- Coverage for many Non-Part D drugs
- Access to RetireeFirst Advocates for assistance with understanding and using your benefits.

### **Important Things to Know:**

- You should be able to use almost any retail pharmacy, as Express Scripts includes over 68,000 in-network pharmacies, nationwide.
- Express Scripts also offers a Mail Order Pharmacy called Express Scripts Pharmacy for your convenience. If you would like to use the Express Scripts Pharmacy, you will need new prescriptions.
- You do not need new prescriptions for retail pharmacies. Simply show your new ID card and your refills will be processed under the Express Scripts PDP Plan.

### **Mailings to Expect in the Coming Month:**

- Express Scripts Approval Letter
- Express Scripts Welcome Kit and ID Card
- Express Scripts Evidence of Coverage (“EOC”)
- Please keep in mind each Retiree, spouse, and/or dependent may receive the above items on different days; this is normal.

*We are required by law to give you the choice of opting out of the new prescription drug plan. Since you are currently enrolled in a Town of Farmington or Farmington Board of Education Prescription Drug Plan it is unlikely that you would not want to participate in the new Express Scripts Prescription Drug Plan. However, you do have the option to opt-out. If you would like to opt-out, please call Kris Ziegler at 860-675-2339 by June 18, 2025.*
